Members seek assistance with the following matters:

- 1. Client was assaulted after taking money out of an automatic teller, he had walked ten to fifteen steps away and was not on bank property. We seek information about previous cases where a plaintiff has proceeded against a bank for not providing safe access and security to an automatic teller machine.
- 2. Client is overweight and a smoker client developed an extensive deep venous thrombosis in the calf. It appears that the surgeon and/or anaesthetist did not take appropriate precautions given our client's obesity and tobacco habit we seek assistance from members who have had a similar case and the experts used.
- 3. Failure to diagnose tuberculosis by general practitioner and possible link to miscarriage after a coughing fit.
- 4. Repetitive strain injury diagnosed and acknowledged by defendant, however pre-existing congenital defect causing problems with pursuing the case.
- 5. Client was injured by fellow player in cricket game and has a serious ongoing injury, which has disrupted his home and work life. Information required on whether the cricket club 1. should have actively let it be known to the members that inadequate insurance cover was available or 2. that the club should have had in place more comprehensive insurance.
- 6. A client severely injured whilst working under a car when a jack collapsed. Matter comes under the Queensland Motor Vehicles Insurance Act 1936-1988 sub section 2(ii) (f). Information needed on similar cases.
- 7. Information needed on cases involving a driver leaving a premises and hitting a cyclist. His view was obscured by a large hedge, however there appears to be no redress against the owner of the premises for the height of the hedge. The driver apparently failed to look to his left where a cyclist was coming along when he was turning right. We need similar cases where a driver has failed to look left and right when coming out of premises.
- 8. Information on kidney failure arising out of the use of the drug Maloprim.
- 9. Previous cases involving the use of the toxic substances Round-up and MCPA, in particular cases involving the aerial and other spraying of areas near schools.
