

Parliament goes live on the Internet

You can now watch the proceedings of Parliament live on the Internet. To view the events visit www.aph.gov.au/live

This service provides seven simultaneous webcast channels. These channels cover the proceedings of both Chambers (House of Representatives and Senate), the House of Representatives Main Committee and up to four other committee public hearings. There is a text caption underneath each of the video streams that describes the current events.

The webcast is available to Internet users on both Windows and Macintosh platforms and can support up to 800 concurrent users. In order to watch and listen to the proceedings, you will need a computer with a sound card, speakers and Microsoft Windows Media Player (Version 6.4 or later). Media Player can be downloaded from a link on the site.

The broadcasts will be available whenever Parliament is sitting. There are links on the site to check the parliamentary sitting calendars and the dates for the next scheduled broadcast.
