Rachel Baird is a Special Counsel at Minter Ellison Lawyers in the firm's Environment and Planning section and an Adjunct Associate Professor in law at the Queensland University of Technology. She has taught environmental law and international environmental law at the University of Melbourne, where she undertook her doctoral studies, and at the University of Queensland. She has researched and published in international fisheries law, climate change law and Commonwealth environmental law. Rachel has served as a permanent Legal Officer in the Royal Australian Air Force and remains an active member of the Air Force legal reserve.

Craig Forrest is a Reader in law and member of the Marine and Shipping Law Unit of the TC Beirne School of Law, University of Queensland. He teaches and undertakes research in Maritime and Shipping law (at undergraduate and postgraduate levels), with a particular interest in wreck, salvage and marine pollution.
