There is no government like no government

LIA NSW Branch recently took advantage of the fact that Karen Coyle, a key note speaker at the 8th Asia-Pacific Specials, Health & Law Librarians Conference was passing through Sydney on her way home to California.

Karen's presentation attracted thirty-seven people to the State Library of New South Wales on Monday 31 August. Her topic was 'There's no government like no government — with a global system like the internet, who gets control and what does it mean for us?'

Karen is a lively and informative speaker who highlighted the changes in the management (or rather non-management) of the internet. She believes that access to information is being dramatically influenced by the fact that businesses can now manipulate the ranking of their information on a web search hit list by buying their position on the list. Access to free, unbiased and accurate information on the web is being reduced due to the growing commercial nature of the internet.

Thanks to EBSCO Information Services who sponsored the seminar. The seminar was a free to members and non-members. The branch viewed the seminar as both an opportunity for CPD and the promotion of ALIA activities to non-members. Approximately seventy-five per cent of those that attended had some kind of ALIA membership affiliation. A follow-up letter of invitation to join ALIA will be sent to the non-members who attended.

Beyond user satisfaction: a qualitative model for evaluating reference service

The CAVAL working party on performance measures for reference services has carried out a five-year research project investigating the effectiveness of reference service.

A 'focus group' methodology was used to gather the implicit indicators being used by the different constituencies of the academic libraries sector in Victoria. The constituencies surveyed included: library managers; reference staff; under-

graduates; and post-graduates/academic and general staff.

Analysis of the data revealed performance indicators common to all groups. A new multi-constituencies model of reference service quality was derived, called the ASK model. It clusters twelve main performance indicators into three key dimensions: Attributes, Support and Knowledge. The working party believes the model may be used across

all library sectors and in the measurement of service provision in the electronic environment.
