THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 5 of 1919.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Interpretation Ordinance 1914.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act* 1910, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Interpretation Ordinance* 1919. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Interpretation Ordinance* 1914, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Interpretation Ordinance* 1914–1919.

2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced on the fourteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen. Commencement.

3. Section three of the *Interpretation Ordinance* 1914 is amended by omitting from the definition of “The Minister” the words “Home Affairs” and inserting in their stead the words “Home and Territories”. Definitions.
