

Necessary conditions—old age pensions.

2. Section seventeen of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph (fa).

Necessary conditions—invalid pensions.

3. Section twenty-two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph (ga) of sub-section (1.) of that section.

Repeal of sections 52A, 52C, 52D, 52E, and 52F.

4.—(1.) Sections fifty-two A, fifty-two C, fifty-two D, fifty-two E and fifty-two F of the Principal Act are repealed.

(2.) All debts due to the Commissioner or the Commonwealth at the date of the commencement of this section under the provisions of any of the sections repealed by this section are hereby cancelled.

Application of insurance moneys.

5. Section fifty-two K of the Principal Act is amended by omitting all the words after the word “purpose” (second occurring) and inserting in their stead the words “the rate of pension payable to the pensioner shall not be reduced by reason of the receipt or ownership of those moneys.”

Repeal of s. 52M.

6.—(1.) Section fifty-two M of the Principal Act is repealed.

(2.) This section shall be deemed to have commenced on the twenty-first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

(3.) All undertakings given pursuant to section fifty-two M of the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908–1932*, or of section fifty-two M of that Act as subsequently amended, and all orders made under that section, shall be deemed to have ceased to have effect on and from the twenty-first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

LOAN APPROPRIATION (UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF).

No. 2 of 1935.

An Act to amend the *Loan Appropriation (Unemployment Relief) Act 1934*.

[Assented to 4th April, 1935.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Loan Appropriation (Unemployment Relief) Act 1935*.

(2.) The *Loan Appropriation (Unemployment Relief) Act 1934** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Loan Appropriation (Unemployment Relief) Act 1934-1935.*

2. Section two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the words "One million five hundred and thirty-three thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds" and inserting in their stead the words "Two million and sixty-four thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds". Appropriation.

3. Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the words "Fifty thousand pounds" and inserting in their stead the words "Forty-five thousand pounds". Assistance for metalliferous mining industry in the Northern Territory.

4. After section seven of the Principal Act the following sections and Schedule are added :—

" 8. Out of the amount appropriated by this Act, the sum of Five thousand pounds may be expended, in such manner and subject to such conditions as the Treasurer approves, in the assistance and development of the metalliferous mining industry in Papua. Assistance for metalliferous mining industry in Papua.

" 9.—(1.) Subject to this Act, there may be granted to each State, by way of financial assistance, an amount not exceeding that specified in this section opposite to the name of that State, namely :— Grants to the States for the purposes of forestry.

(2.) Any amount granted to a State under this section shall be paid upon the condition that it is used by the State, in such manner and subject to such conditions as the Treasurer approves, for the purposes of forestry.

" 10. Out of the amount appropriated by this Act, there may be expended, for the purposes of forestry in the Territory for the Seat of Government, the sum of Nine thousand pounds. Grant for forestry in the Territory for the Seat of Government.

" 11. Out of the amount appropriated by this Act, there may be expended by the Commonwealth, for the purposes set forth in the Schedule to this Act, the amounts respectively specified in that Schedule in respect of those purposes. Expenditure for purposes specified in Schedule.

An Act to amend section twelve of the *Dried Fruits Export Control Act 1924-1934*.
