Act No. 8, 1974.

An Act to increase the salaries of the Judges of the Supreme Court, the former District Courts and the present District Court and of the holders of certain other statutory offices; for this and other purposes to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Supreme Court Act, 1970, the District Courts Act, 1912, the District Court Act, 1973, the Public Service Act, 1902, the Western Lands Act of 1901, the Valuation of Land Act, 1916, the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1940, and certain other Acts in certain respects; to repeal the Statutory Salaries Adjustment Act, 1971; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to. 26th March, 1974.]

Statutory Salaries Adjustment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by No. 8, 1974
 and with the advice and consent of the Legislative
 Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in
 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutory Salaries Short title.
 Adjustment Act, 1974".

2. (1) The salary payable to the holder of an office Salaries of

 specified in Column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 1 pursuant to the
 enactment specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that
 Part—

- (a) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 29th May, 1973, and ending on, and including, 31st December, 1973, be deemed to have been increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part;
- (b) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st January, 1974, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act, be deemed to have been increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 4 of that Part; and
- (c) is, on and after the date of assent to this Act, increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 4 of that Part.

(2) The salary payable to the holder of an office specified in Column 1 of Part 2 of Schedule 1 pursuant to the enactment specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that Part shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 29th May, 1973, and ending on, and including, 30th June, 1973, be deemed to have been increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part.

(3) The salary payable to the holder of an office specified in Column 1 of Part 3 of Schedule 1 pursuant to the enactment specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that Part—

- (a) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st July, 1973, and ending on, and including, 31st December, 1973, be deemed to have been increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part;
- (b) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st January, 1974, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act, be deemed to have been increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 4 of that Part; and
- (c) is, on and after the date of assent to this Act, increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 4 of that Part.

3. (1) The holder of an office specified in Column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2—

- (a) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 29th May, 1973, and ending on, and including, 31st December, 1973, be deemed to have been entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that Part;
- (b) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st January, 1974, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act, be deemed to have been entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part; and
- (c) is, on and after the date of assent to this Act, increased to the amount specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part.

(2) The holder of an office specified in Column 1 of No. 8, 1974 Part 2 of Schedule 2 shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 29th May, 1973, and ending on, and including, 30th June, 1973, be deemed to have been entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that Part.

(3) The holder of an office specified in Column 1 of Part 3 of Schedule 2—

- (a) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st July, 1973, and ending on, and including 31st December, 1973, be deemed to have been entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 2 of that Part;
- (b) shall, in respect of the period commencing on, and including, 1st January, 1974, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act, be deemed to have been entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part; and
- (c) is, on and after the date of assent to this Act, entitled to receive an allowance for special expenses incurred by him in the capacity of holder of the particular office at the annual rate specified opposite that office in Column 3 of that Part.

(4) Any allowance to which the holder of any office referred to in subsection (1), (2) or (3) is deemed to have been entitled under any such subsection in respect of any period before the date of assent to this Act shall be reduced by the amount of any allowance to which he is or was entitled under the Statutory Salaries Adjustment Act, 1971, in respect of that period.

4. The holder of an office specified in Schedule 3 shall, in respect of the year ending on the thirtieth day of November, 1974, and in respect of each subsequent year ending on the thirtieth day of November, be entitled to be paid, by way of a lump sum, in addition to the allowance provided in respect of the holder of that office by section 3, a recreation leave allowance of \$150 at such time as the Minister determines.
