

SYDNEY WATER SUPPLY ACT.

Act No. 7, 1922.

George V, An Act to sanction the carrying out of certain works
No. 7. in order to amplify and improve the Sydney
Water Supply; and for purposes connected
therewith. [Assented to, 12th September,
1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the “Sydney Water
Supply Act, 1922.”

2. The carrying out of the works described in the George V, First, Second, and Third Schedules is hereby sanctioned, No. 7. and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to Works sanctioned. carry out the said works.

3. The cost of carrying out the works described in the First Schedule is estimated at two million four hundred and twenty-eight thousand two hundred and ninety-three pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Estimated cost of works described in Schedule I.

4. The cost of carrying out the works described in the Second Schedule is estimated at two hundred and fifty-two thousand five hundred and ninety-nine pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Estimated cost of works described in Schedule II.

5. The cost of carrying out the works described in the Third Schedule is estimated at three hundred and eighteen thousand three hundred pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Estimated cost of works described in Schedule III.

6. On the completion of the said works or any of them the Governor shall forthwith notify the same in the Gazette, and upon such notification the works described in such notification shall be vested in the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage under the provisions of and for the purposes of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts, 1880-1916.
