Act No. 50, 1977.

An Act to amend the Teaching Service Act, 1970, for the purpose of enabling persons who are not British subjects to be permanently appointed to offices in the Teaching Service. [Assented to, 21st June, 1977.]

Teaching Service (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Teaching Service (Amendment) Act, 1977".

Amendment of Act No. 4, 1970. Sec. 23. (Director-General's powers to appoint permanent teaching and associated staff.)

- 2. The Teaching Service Act, 1970, is amended—
 - (a) by inserting in section 23 (2) (a) (ii) after the word "office;" the word "and";
 - (b) by omitting from section 23 (2) (b) the words "fitness; and" and by inserting instead the word "fitness.";
 - (c) by omitting section 23 (2) (c);
 - (d) by omitting from section 23 (4) the following words:—

appointment,

but shall not confirm the appointment of a person referred to in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (c) of subsection two of this section unless that person has become a British subject.

and by inserting instead the word "appointment.".
