Explanatory note

The *Annual Reports (Statutory Bodies) Act 1984* requires the annual reports of statutory bodies to be presented to Parliament. Clause 17 (3) of the *Annual Reports (Statutory Bodies) Regulation 1995* provides that an additional copy of an annual report of a statutory body is to be provided to the Clerk of the Parliaments and the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly in a computer readable form. The object of this Regulation is to remove the requirement for an additional computer readable copy to be provided to Parliament.

This Regulation is made under the *Annual Reports (Statutory Bodies) Act 1984*, including section 17 (the general regulation-making power).
