His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following By-law under the *Crown Lands Act 1989*.

Explanatory note

Clause 23 of the *Crown Lands (General Reserves) By-law 1995* allows a public notice displayed on a reserve to prohibit persons having or keeping any dogs or other animals on the reserve unless the animal is a guide dog accompanying a person who is blind or hearing-impaired (clause 23 (2) (o) and (3)).

The object of this By-law is to amend the *Crown Lands (General Reserves) By-law 1995* to ensure that it is consistent with the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* of the Commonwealth by providing that the exception to the prohibition in clause 23 applies to all animals trained to assist persons with a disability and not only guide dogs for the blind and hearing impaired.

This By-law is made under the *Crown Lands Act 1989*, including section 128 (the general by-law making power).

- (3) Nothing in this clause prohibits a person with a disability (within the meaning of the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* of the Commonwealth) from being accompanied by an assistance animal (that is, an animal referred to in section 9 of that Act).
