EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Proclamation is to commence on 1 July 1992 the remaining uncommenced provision relating to the Workers Compensation Act 1987 contained in Schedule 1 to the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act (No. 2) 1991.

That provision amends section 172 of the Act and provides for a new method of calculating interest on unpaid insurance premiums.

The commencement dates for the other amendments to the Workers Compensation Act 1987 contained in Schedule 1 are as follows:

- items (3) and (4) (b) are taken to have commenced on 1 February 1990;
- item (1) is taken to have commenced on 1 July 1990;
- items (4) (a) and (10) commenced on assent (17 December 1991);
- items (2), (5) and (7)–(9) commenced on 1 February 1992.
