

2. Section three of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is inserted in lieu thereof:—

“[3.] The Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare any Officers of the Crown, not exceeding nine in all, and being Officers liable to retire from office on political grounds, to be capable of being elected members of the Legislative Assembly and of sitting and voting therein at the same time.”

Application

3. This Act applies as well to the present Legislative Assembly as to every Legislative Assembly hereafter to be summoned and chosen.

THE APPROPRIATION
ACT OF

An Act to Authorise the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland of further Sums of Money towards the Service of the Year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1923.

[ASSENTED TO 16TH AUGUST, 1922.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS we, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the members of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, have in the present Session of Parliament cheerfully granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, in addition to the sums already granted during the last Session of Parliament towards the same services: And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland the sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Appropriation.

1. In addition to the sums of One million two hundred thousand pounds already applied from the Consolidated Revenue Fund (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account), Five hundred thousand pounds already applied from the Trust and

Appropriation Acts.

Special Funds, and Four hundred thousand pounds already applied from the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, by **"The Appropriation Act of 1921-1922, No. 3,"* there shall and may be issued and applied towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the sums following, that is to say :—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account) the sum of Two million pounds;

From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of One million two hundred and fifty thousand pounds; and

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the Sum of One million two hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

2. The Treasurer of the State shall issue and pay the said several sums for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for sums paid in pursuance of warrant.

4. This Act may be cited as "*The Appropriation Act* Short title. of 1922-1923, No. 1."
