An Act to Apply certain Sums of Money out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Years ending on the last days of June, 1940 and 1941, and certain Further Sums to the Service of the Year ended on the last day of June, 1939, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in the last and present Sessions of Parliament.

[ASSENTED TO 21ST NOVEMBER, 1939.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—

Preamble.

WE, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in the last and present Sessions of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Appropriation.
[Schedule,
Parts A, B, C,
D, and E.]

1. In addition to the several sums specified in the Parts marked respectively A, B, C, D, and E of the Schedule to this Act, and which sums are payable under the authority of the several Acts in those Parts respectively mentioned, there shall and may be issued and applied, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty, the sums following, inclusive of the two sums of Four million six hundred thousand pounds, and Seven million three hundred thousand pounds, already authorised to be applied towards the service of the year ending on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty, by **"The Appropriation Act of 1938-1939, No. 2,"* and †*"The Appropriation Act of 1939-1940, No. 1,"* respectively, that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland (exclusive of the moneys standing to the

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credit of the Loan Fund Account), the sum of Thirteen million nine hundred and forty-four thousand six hundred and sixty-one pounds ;

From the Trust and Special Funds, the sum of Eight million four hundred and seventy-one thousand and ninety-five pounds ;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Three million eight hundred and forty-one thousand pounds.

2. There shall and may be issued and applied, Appropriation. towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, the sums following, that is to say,—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account), the sum of Two million five hundred thousand pounds ;

From the Trust and Special Funds, the sum of One million five hundred thousand pounds ;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, the sum of Six hundred thousand pounds.

3. The sums granted by the first section of this Act and by **"The Appropriation Act of 1938-1939, No. 2,"* Appropriation of sums voted for and †*"The Appropriation Act of 1939-1940, No. 1,"* Supply services. which are set forth in the Parts marked respectively F, G, and H of the Schedule to this Act, amounting as [Schedule, Parts F, G, and H.] appears by the said Parts, in all to the sum of Twenty-six million two hundred and fifty-six thousand seven hundred and fifty-six pounds, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, for the purposes and services expressed in the said Parts F, G, and H, respectively.

4. There shall and may be issued and applied the further sums following, that is to say,— Supplementary appropriation, 1938-1939.

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account), a further

sum of One million two hundred and ninety-four thousand nine hundred and forty-one pounds seventeen shillings ;

From the Trust and Special Funds, a further sum of Six hundred and sixty-seven thousand six hundred and nineteen pounds, sixteen shillings ;

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account, a further sum of Four hundred and thirty-five thousand and eighteen pounds fourteen shillings and eight pence ;

to defray Supplementary Charges for the service of the year ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and such sums shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, for the purposes and services expressed in the Parts marked I, J, and K of the Schedule to this Act.

5. The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order under his hand and directed to the Treasurer, from time to time orders and directs, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland.

6. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrants or orders, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the moneys are paid shall be a valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for any sum therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Indemnity.

7. The issue or application of any part or parts of the said sums of One million two hundred and ninety-four thousand nine hundred and forty-one pounds seventeen shillings, Six hundred and sixty-seven thousand six hundred and nineteen pounds sixteen shillings, and Four hundred and thirty-five thousand and eighteen pounds fourteen shillings and eight pence, which has been made before the passing of this Act for

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the purposes expressed in the Parts marked I, J, and K of the Schedule to this Act, is hereby authorised and sanctioned, and the Treasurer is hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of any such issue or application. [Schedule, Parts I, J, and K.]

8. This Act may be cited as "*The Appropriation Act of 1939-1940, No. 2.*" Short title.
