An Act for the further appropriation of the revenue of the State for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 23rd June, 1955.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act (No. 1), 1955". Short title

2. Out of the moneys paid to the State by the Commonwealth of Australia, and any other General Revenue of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there may be further issued, in addition to all sums by any other Act authorized to be issued and applied for defraying the charges of the State Government for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, any further sum or sums not exceeding in the whole seven hundred and four thousand one hundred and forty-seven pounds. Further issue.

3. All moneys issued under this Act, not exceeding the sum hereinbefore mentioned, shall be applied and appropriated for the following purposes— Appropriation of General Revenue issued under this Act.

4. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the amount hereinbefore specified, in such portions as the Governor directs by any orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, is hereby authorized ; and the Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly ; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sums for which the receipts are given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

5. (1) In this section—
“the interim period”—

(a) in relation to any officer means the period commencing on 20th December, 1954, and ending on the day when a return applicable to the salary of the officer is made ;

(b) in relation to a teacher means the period commencing on 20th December, 1954, and ending on 18th March, 1955.

“return” means any return which was made by the Public Service Board on or after 21st February, 1955, and operates as from 20th December, 1954.

“the teachers award” means the award which was made by the Teachers Salaries Board on 18th March, 1955, and operates as from 20th December, 1954.

(2) Where an officer whose salary was increased by a return, or a teacher whose salary was increased by the teachers award, has retired or died during the interim period and a direction has been given under section 76a of the Public Service Act, 1936-1954, or under section 18a of the Education Act, 1915-1954, that a cash payment in lieu of leave not taken be made to that officer, or teacher, or his dependants or representatives, that direction shall, unless the Governor otherwise directs, authorize the payment of an amount calculated on the basis of the officer's or teacher's salary as so increased.

(3) Where an officer, the salary of whose office was increased by a return, has died before 20th December, 1954, and the Governor has directed, under subsection (8) of section 75 of the Public Service Act, 1936-1954, that an amount of salary be paid to the dependants or representatives of that officer, and the period in respect of which such salary is to be calculated falls wholly or partially within the interim period, the direction shall authorize the payment of an amount of salary which includes the increase made by the return.

(4) This section shall apply to directions given by the Governor as mentioned in subsections (2) and (3) of this section either before or after the passing of this Act.

(5) The Treasurer, out of the General Revenue of the State, may make any payments, including additions to payments made before the passing of this Act, which it is necessary to make in order to give effect to this section. This section, without further appropriation, shall be sufficient authority for making such payments.
