An Act to amend the Pawnbrokers Act, 1888-1934.

[Assented to 16th November, 1950.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Pawnbrokers Act Amendment Act, 1950".
- (2) The Pawnbrokers Act, 1888-1934, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Pawnbrokers Act, 1888-1950".
- (3) The Pawnbrokers Act, 1888-1934, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Enactment of

2. The following section is enacted and inserted in the s. 45a of principal Act after section 45 thereof:

Production of books, etc.

- 45a. (1) Every pawnbroker shall, upon request, produce to any member of the police force, during all reasonable hours in the day-time, any books or documents which are by this Act required to be kept by the pawnbroker and any pledges in his possession.
- (2) Any pawnbroker who is guilty of any contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this

Drafting amendment of s. 34 of principal Act.

3. Section 34 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the figures "1876" in the fifth to last line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the figures "1935".

4. Form No. II. in the first schedule to the principal Act is amended by inserting the words "and a half pence" after the word "penny" second occurring in the paragraph commencing "The pawnbroker is entitled to charge" in the Part thereof headed "B. For a loan of above ten shillings."
