AN ACT for preserving in a pure and wholesome state the Water of the New Town Rivulet.

W HEREAS it is necessary to make such provisions as are herein- PREAMBLE. after contained for ensuring a Supply of Pure Water for the use of the Inhabitants of New Town-BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer and a Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies with the advice of the Legislative Council that if any person shall after the publication Person preventing of this Act wilfully prevent the flow of Water to or in the New Town the flow of Water Rivulet or shall cause or knowingly suffer any filth stones soil or or throwing in rubbish or any noxious offensive or unwholesome thing or matter to matter or injuring fall or to be cast or to flow into the same Rivulet or into any Spring the Banks liable or Stream forming a source of such Rivulet or shall wilfully and to penalty of $\pounds 50$. maliciously destroy or injure any of the Banks of the said Rivulet or shall do any Act calculated to render the Water therein unwholesome or offensive every such person so offending shall upon conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum of not more than Fifty Pounds.

Proceedings to be summary.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED that all offences against this Act shall upon information in that behalf exhibited be in a summary way heard and determined and all fines and penalties in respect of the same shall be imposed by and before any two Justices of the Peace and every Person feeling aggrieved by any Judgment or Conviction of such Justices shall be entitled to appeal therefrom in the manner provided by the Act intituled An Act to regulate Summary Proceedings before Justices of the Peace and no prosecution under this Act shall be allowed unless the information therein shall be exhibited within three calendar months after the time of the offence committed.
