AN ACT Supplementary to the Act for applying certain Sums arising from the General Revenue of the Colony of *Tasmania* to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six. [5 June, 1857.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of *Tasmania* by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly in Parliament assembled as follows—

1 Out of the General Revenue of the Colony of *Tasmania* there shall and may be appropriated to the Public Service within the said Colony and issued and applied the sum of Sixty-one thousand nine hundred and sixteen pounds eleven shillings and two pence to defray the Supplementary charge on the Colonial Treasury for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six as hereinafter more particularly expressed—that is to say—the sum of Two thousand six hundred and seventy-three pounds twelve shillings and ten pence to defray the expense of the items under the heads of Executive Council Port Officer

Public Works Government Printer Aborigines Registrar of Births Deaths and Marriages and Coroners' Inquests and the sum of Two thousand three hundred and forty-six pounds nine shillings and eleven pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Pensions Retired Allowances and Gratuities and the sum of One thousand and seven pounds ten shillings and eleven pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Revenue Services and the sum of Seventeen hundred and seven pounds thirteen shillings and four pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Charitable Allowances and the sum of Two thousand two hundred and twenty-nine pounds and two pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Education and the sum of One hundred and ninety-eight pounds three shillings and sixpence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Transport and the sum of One hundred and twenty-five pounds to defray the expense of the item under the head of Rent and the sum of Fifteen thousand one hundred and ninety-seven pounds fourteen shillings and four pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Works and Buildings and the sum of Nine thousand one hundred and thirty-one pounds sixteen shillings and seven pence to defray the expense of the items under the head of Roads and Streets and the sum of Thirteen thousand eight hundred and ninety-six pounds nineteen shillings and one penny to defray the expense of the items under the head of Miscellaneous and the sum of Eleven hundred and sixty-two pounds eight shillings and eleven pence to defray the expense of the item under the head of Drawbacks and the sum of Eleven hundred and eighty pounds and five shillings to defray the expense of the item under the head of Survey and the sum of Two thousand one hundred and eighty pounds and eleven pence to defray the expense of the item under the head of Assessments and the sum of Seven thousand six hundred and thirty-one pounds and seven shillings to defray the expense of the items under the head of Immigration and the sum of Twelve hundred and forty-eight pounds eight shillings and eight pence to defray the expense of the item under the head of Accountant of Stores.

2 The Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being by any Warrant or Order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

3 The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such Warrant or Order in writing as aforesaid and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
