

AN ACT to authorise the Construction of a Line A.D. 1883. of Railway from Parattah to Oatlands. [29 October, 1883.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—

Interpretation.

- "The Minister" means the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being, and includes any Contractor or other person appointed or employed by him:
- "The Railway" includes all works and buildings erected or built on or connected with the Railway to be constructed under this Act, the land upon which the same are or may be respectively erected or built, all land used in connection therewith, and all plant, rolling-stock, steam cars, engines, machinery, and carriages used with the same:
- "The purposes of this Act" shall mean the execution of all works necessary to construct, uphold, and maintain the Railway.
- 2 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed and Minister to cause completed a Line of Railway from Parattah, on the Main Line Line of Railway, Railway, to the Town of Oatlands, at a cost for the same not exceeding to be constructed. Eight thousand Pounds.

Defrayment of cost of works.

3 All moneys to be expended under and for the purposes of this Act shall be defrayed out of funds provided by Parliament for the purposes of this Act.

Provisions of 46 Vict. No. 22 incorporated. 4 All the provisions contained in Sections Nine to Fifty-seven, both inclusive, of "The Mersey and Deloraine Railway Act, 1882," are hereby incorporated with this Act, and where in any of the said Sections the said Act is referred to the same shall be deemed to refer to this Act. Where in the said Act any matter is authorised and required to be done by Two Justices, the same shall mean Two Justices assembled and acting together.
