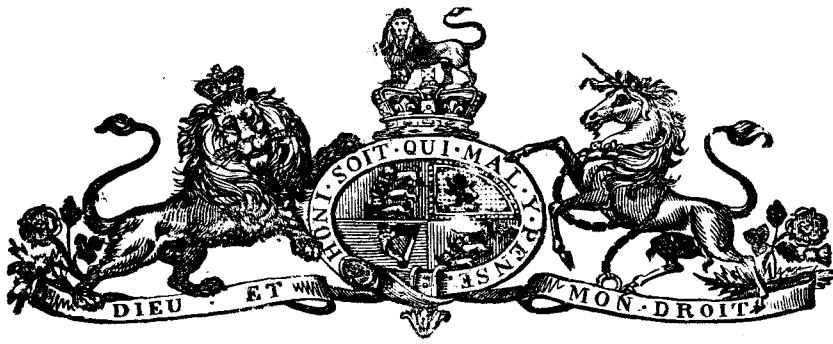

ANNO QUADRAGESIMO-QUINTO

VICTORIÆ REGINÆ,

No. 36.

AN ACT to authorise the Minister of Lands and Works to acquire a certain piece of Land. A.D. 1881.
[8 November, 1881.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 The Minister of Lands and Works for the time being may, if the Governor in Council approves, out of any moneys which have been or may be provided by Parliament for that purpose, purchase and acquire, at a price not exceeding Two thousand Pounds, the piece of land described and set forth in the Schedule; but such piece of land, as and when the same shall be purchased and acquired by the Minister, shall be conveyed to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors.

Minister of Lands and Works empowered to purchase a certain piece of land.

2 No deed or other instrument made by, to, or with the Minister or Her Majesty the Queen under this Act shall be subject to any Stamp Duty now or hereafter imposed by any Act.

Deeds not liable to Stamp Duty.

SCHEDULE.

CITY OF HOBART.

Section P 3.

0A. 1R. 1½P.

(Comprising Lots 9 and 10 purchased by *Askin Morrison*, and Lot 11 purchased by *Frederick Robert Lees*).

Bounded on the north west by one chain ninety-four links and three-quarters of a link south-westerly along *Davey-street* commencing at the angle thereof with *Murray-street*, on the south west by one chain and thirty-five links south-easterly along Lot 12, on the south east by two chains twenty-six links and one quarter of a link in two bearings north-easterly along a roadway and along Lot 3 purchased by *Askin Morrison* to *Murray-street* aforesaid, and thence on the north east by one chain and six links north-westerly along that street to the point of commencement.
