

AN ACT to vest a certain Street or Lane at *New Norfolk* in Her Majesty. [1 February, 1862.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that a certain Street or Lane at *New Norfolk*, in this Colony, should cease to be a Public Street, and should be vested in Her Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that all that Street or Lane at *New Norfolk* of the width of fifty links extending from *Burnett-street* to *Humphrey-street*, distant six chains and ninety links or thereabouts in a south-easterly direction along *Burnett-street* from *George-street*, and bounded on the south east by the Hospital Ground, and on the north west by an allotment known as the Barrack Ground, shall, on and after the passing of this Act, become and be vested in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors; and the said Street or Lane shall thenceforth cease to be a public and common highway and thoroughfare; and may lawfully be enclosed by walls or otherwise, and appropriated to such purposes as Her Majesty or the Governor, acting on Her Majesty's behalf, shall deem expedient.

PREAMBLE.

Vests a Street or Lane running from *Burnett-street* to *Humphrey-street*, *New Norfolk*, in Her Majesty.
