*By His Excellency SIR HENRY EDWARD FOX YOUNG, Knight,
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Island of Van
Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the Advice and
Consent of the Legislative Council.*

AN ACT to vest a Portion of Bathurst Street, Launceston, in Her Majesty. [30th August, 1855.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that a certain portion of *Bathurst* Street, in *Launceston*, in this Colony, should cease to be a public street, and should be vested in Her Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Van Diemen's Land, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, that the portion of *Bathurst* Street, in *Launceston* aforesaid, bounded as follows, that is to say, on the north east by three chains forty links south-easterly along the Treadmill allotment commencing at the west angle thereof on *Patterson* Street and extending to a grant to *John Atkinson*, on the south east by one chain three links or thereabouts in a south-westerly direction across *Bathurst* Street to the north angle of an allotment granted to *Thomas Knowles*, thence by a line of seventy-five links or thereabouts in a north-westerly direction along Crown land to the Gaol allotment, on the north west by twenty-seven links or thereabouts north-easterly also along that allotment, thence again on the south

west by two chains eighty-seven links north-westerly also along that allotment to *Patterson* Street aforesaid, and thence by a north-easterly line of eighty-one links to the point of commencement, and all right, title, and interest in and to the same, shall, on and after the passing of this Act, become and be vested in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors; and the said portion of *Bathurst* Street aforesaid shall thenceforth cease to be a public and common highway and thoroughfare, and may lawfully be enclosed by walls or otherwise, and appropriated to such purposes as Her Majesty, or the Governor acting on Her Majesty's behalf, shall deem expedient.
