No. XXXV.

An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Victoria to the Service thereof, for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [Assented to 31st May, 1855.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to appropriate to the public service within Victoria the Revenues under the control and at the disposal of the Legislative Council thereof as hereafter mentioned :

Preamble.

I. Out of the monies disposable by the said Legislative Council there shall and may be appropriated to the public service and issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding Six thousand six hundred and fifty pounds to defray the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Legislative Council Department of the said Colony for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

Out of the monies disposable by the Legislative Council there shall and may be appropriated to the public service and issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding Thirty-one thousand two hundred and ninety pounds towards defraying the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Executive Departments of the said Colony next hereinafter mentioned for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five in addition to the amount appropriated for these purposes by Schedule B part 2 to the said Act of Parliament that is to say any sum or sums of money not exceeding Thirteen thousand and seventy pounds, to defray the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Colonial Secretary's department and any sum or sums of money not exceeding Seven thousand one hundred and thirty-five pounds to defray the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Colonial Treasurer's department and any sum or sums of money not exceeding Ten thousand five hundred and fifteen pounds to defray the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Auditor General's department and any sum or sums of money not exceeding Five hundred and seventy pounds to defray the salaries allowances and contingencies of the Executive Council department.
