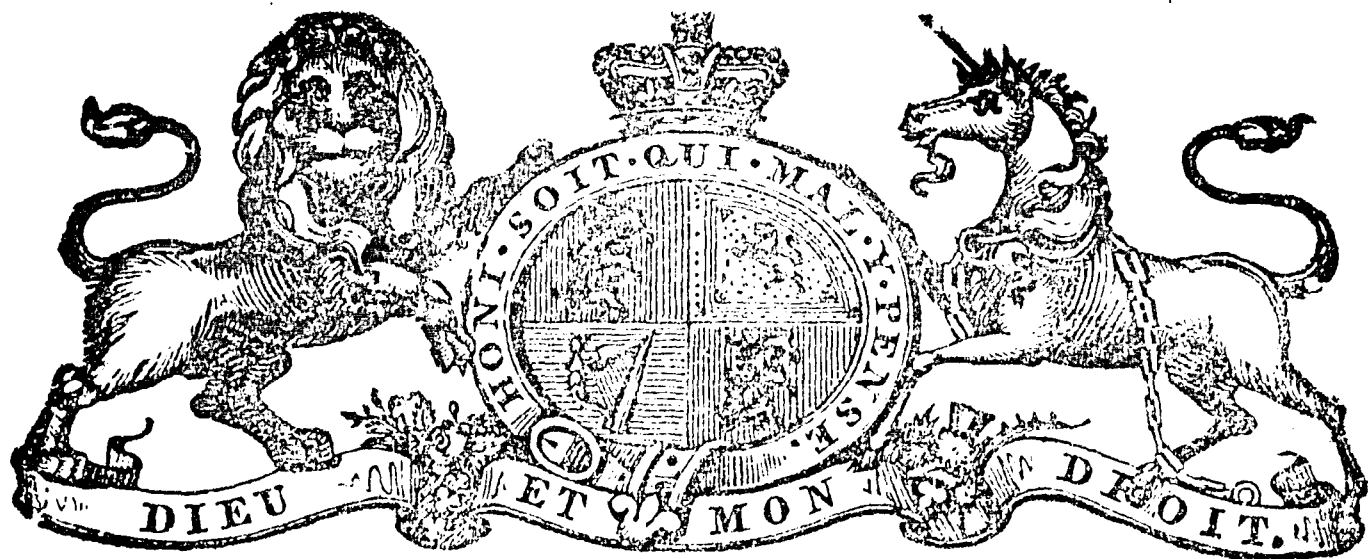

An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Eight hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and eight.

[31st October 1877.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN—

WE Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in Parliament assembled towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Preamble.

1. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and eight the sum of Eight hundred thousand pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue, and the Treasurer of Victoria is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

Issue and application of £800,000.

2. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor under the provisions of the law now in force in respect of any services voted by the Legislative Assembly in this present Session of Parliament.

Sum available for the purposes voted by Legislative Assembly.
