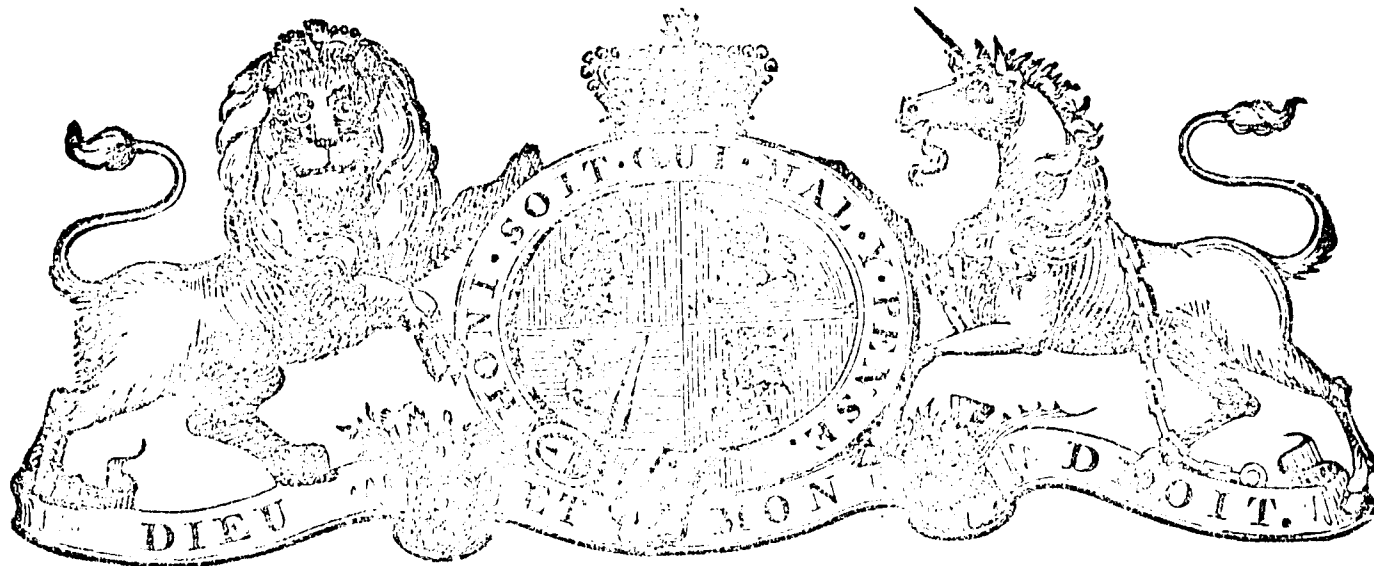

An Act to provide further for the Salaries of the  
Judges of the Supreme Court of the Colony of  
Victoria.  
[17th December 1872.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN—

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to increase the salaries of the Judges of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria to the amounts hereinafter specified, we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in Parliament assembled do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. The present and all future Judges of the Supreme Court shall from and after the first day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three be entitled in addition to such salaries as are provided by law to such further payments by way of salary as will make such salaries amount in the whole to the annual salaries following (that is to say): For the Chief Justice a salary of Three thousand five hundred pounds, and for each Puisne Judge a salary of Three thousand pounds; and such additional salaries shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue of the colony of Victoria, which is hereby appropriated for that purpose accordingly.

*Preamble.*  
Salary of Chief Justice increased to £3,500, and of each Puisne Judge to £3,000.
