An Act to provide for the Vesting of certain Unalienated Lands of the Crown in the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington, and for other purposes.

[4th June, 1957.]

HEREAS by the Mornington Land Act 1930-

Preamble, No. 3917.

- (a) the Orders in Council temporarily reserving the lands described in the First Schedule to that First Schedule. Act for market purposes were revoked and such lands were authorized to be sold by auction;
- (b) the lands described in the Second and Third No. 3917. Schedules to that Act which had been purchased Third Schedules. by the President Councillors and Ratepavers of the Shire of Mornington (hereinafter called the Shire) were vested in the Crown and authorized to be permanently reserved for market purposes; and

be paid to the Shire: And whereas the lands described in the First Schedule to that Act were offered for sale by auction but were not sold:

And whereas the lands described in the Second and Third Schedules to that Act have not been permanently reserved for market purposes :

And whereas the Shire desires to provide an abattoir and saleyard within the municipal district of the Shire :

And whereas the lands described in the Second and Third Schedules to that Act are not sufficient for such purposes:

And whereas in lieu of the provisions made by the Mornington Land Act 1930 it is expedient to authorize the re-vesting in the Shire of such part of the land described in the said Second and Third Schedules as is described in the Schedule to this Act so that such land may be sold by the Shire and the proceeds of sale used in or towards the cost of acquiring land suitable for an abattoir and saleyard:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. This Act may be cited as the Mornington Land

2. The Governor in Council is hereby authorized and empowered to grant the land described in the Schedule to this Act to the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington for an estate in fee simple subject to such terms and conditions as he thinks fit.

SCHEDULE.

Four acres one rood six perches, more or less, Parish of Moorooduc, County of Mornington: Commencing on the north-eastern boundary of allotment 6, section 22, at a point bearing N. 28° 46' W. four chains from the eastern angle of the said allotment; bounded thence by lines bearing S. 46° 7' W. two chains seventy-four and five-tenths links and S. 28° 57' E. four chains and five-tenths of a link; by the Nepean-highway bearing S. 45° 59' W. six chains four and eight-tenths links; by lines bearing N. 45° 21' W. five chains seventy-nine and seven-tenths links, N. 45° 54' E. five chains forty-nine links, N. 46° 7' E. two chains twenty-seven and four-tenths links, S. 28° 46' E. ninety and nine-tenths links and N. 46° 7' E. two chains seventy-three and two-tenths links; and thence by a road bearing S. 28° 46' E. one chain nine and three-tenths links to the point of commencement.
